

Dear Neighbors, A Message From Mayor Farnsley


I am writing to provide an update regarding our police and regarding public safety.

Prospect's Police Department Is Understaffed As I will report below, we have taken steps to fix this problem. Because we do not have a full complement of officers, we do not have a Prospect police officer on duty in the city for approximately two hours per day. During those times, calls to (502) 228-COPS will still always be answered -- however the dispatcher will send a Louisville police officer to respond to the call. In any situation in which you need to contact the police, please continue to call (502) 228-COPS or if it's an emergency call 911.

In the past year, two of our fulltime officers resigned to accept positions with nearby departments that paid more than Prospect. We have been unsuccessful in our efforts to fill those vacancies. The budget that the Council has approved for the fiscal year that begins on Monday, July 1, provides sufficient funds for us to increase compensation for our fulltime officers significantly. Our chief and assistant chief advise that this change assists in two ways. First, the increase will help us retain the outstanding officers we currently employ. Second, the increase will assist in recruiting qualified officers to fill the vacancies in our department.

Additional Flock Cameras The city has added Flock Cameras along





U.S. 42 at the en-

trances to Hunting Creek, Fox Harbor, the Landings, and Bridgepointe. These cameras read license plates and will alert our police when a car that has been stolen or that is owned by someone with an outstanding arrest warrant enters these neighborhoods. Additional cameras placed by HOA's in Sutherland, Innisbrook, and the Estates of Hunting Creek help with security in the city. Flock cameras have proven to be an effective tool in fighting crime in many cities, and they enhance our crime-fighting efforts.

Car Thefts And Burglaries In Prospect Recently armed criminals have entered the city during the overnight hours to steal cars. They almost always ignore cars that are locked. If a car is unlocked, they will check to see if the keys are in the car. If the keys are not in the car, they will push the garage door opener. If the keys are not in a car in the garage, they will try the door from the garage into the house in search of car keys. Criminals have recently entered houses in Prospect in this way. Please lock your cars and close your garage doors. These two simple steps will help make Prospect a less attractive target and will help make us all safer.

period of two years and the city has adopted the stretch of 42 from Bridge Pointe to Rose Island Road. Groups sign a contract with the Transportation Cabinet, which recognizes the need and desirability of a clean environment and permits the group to contribute toward that effort. Litter pickups are held at least 3 times per year and *the next one is planned soon*. ## Lost, but now found?

Many items get turned in to City Hall that get left and or lost in the city's parks. If you or one of the "kiddos" did happen to lose something in one of Prospect's beautiful parks, then we may be able to help! Lost items are found and or turned in at City Hall on a regular basis. Regular items include everything from car keys and glasses to a childs camera. So, if little William lost his "wubbie" or Big Bill misplaced the Mercedes keys, before you give up hope, give us a call at 228-1121 and see if we have it. Items are generally held onto for two to three months. Lock It To Stop It! Most of the theft in Prospect this year could have been simply prevented. How you ask? BY LOCKING YOUR VEHICLE! Most of the thefts in Prospect were from

unlocked vehicles! These are almost always crimes of convenience, so don't give thieves incentive to break into your auto.

NEVER leave valuables like purses, lap tops, cash or extra keys to your car or truck overnight. If you park in your driveway remove your garage door opener. A stolen opener becomes easy access to your house. Please lock the pedestrian door between your garage and your house.

And never EVER store guns in your unattended car. A gun stolen from your vehicle is a violent crime waiting to happen, a crime YOU could have prevented.

### From Your Prospect Police Department

• If you need to report a crime or speak with an officer please call the JCSO dispatch at 228-2677 (COPS). They are the ones who send the police to your home or an accident scene. We will no longer be dispatching officers to any locations if you call city hall or the police department directly. As always. If it is an emergency, please call 911.

• With the arrival of spring many of those "Honey Do" lists have gotten out of control. Code enforcement would just like to remind you of the following things that need permits.

Boat, PODS, Trailers, U-Haul's, Shipping Containers, RVs, dumpsters..... anything besides a vehicle that gets parked in your driveway overnight. And these items MUST be in your driveway, they can not be parked in the street. If you add to your home, such as a sunroom, fence, retaining wall or a pool, these need permits as well.
